# Prayers and Reflections for use at home on Trinity 12 Price of the Prize

### **PREPARING OURSELVES**

Take a moment to be still in God's presence and feel his love. If you are indoors, you may wish to light a candle as a sign of God's love - here, in your room. You may also wish to have a bowl of water ready for the time of letting go. When you are ready, say this opening prayer.

Lord, as I sit and wait in silence,
I place my hopes and dreams,
my fears and concerns,
into your safe and loving hands.
Enfold me with your love,
make my heart beat in time with yours;
in Jesus' name,
I pray. Amen.

### **LETTING GO**

If you come to this time of prayer and reflection with any regrets, with things that you wish you had not said, done or been, offer them to God in the silence of your heart. And then, reflect on the words of this next verse.

Christ is the one who seeks, to whom our souls are known. The word of love he speaks can wake a heart of stone; for at the sound the blind can see, the slave is free, the lost are found.

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If you wish, dip your finger into a bowl of water and make the sign of the cross on your palm.

Feel God's forgiveness.

Our verse reminds me of two key bible passages: a prophecy in Ezekiel, and an answer to a question put to Jesus. God speaks to his people in exile in Babylon. Their suffering is drawing to a close. Freedom is coming and they will be his people once more. They will love him with every fibre of their being. You can really sense God's deep love for his wayward ones, and how he can transform their hearts and souls.

I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you;
I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.

Ezekiel 36:26

This is the transformation that Jesus is seeking to make in the hearts of those who are wondering whether to follow him. We can experience this change through the gift of his Spirit within us. Pause to ponder your own experience of this.


For this is a sign that Jesus is the one - the Messiah - that the crowds were seeking as well as John the Baptist too. John is in prison and sends two of his disciples to ask this vital question:

When the men came to Jesus,
they said, 'John the Baptist sends us to you to ask,
"Are you the one who is to come,
or should we expect someone else?"'

Luke 7:20

Jesus replies by sending them to tell John what they have seen, namely, the blind see, the lame walk, etc. Yes, he is the one! You can tell this by what he does. This is who we are following! The one would can do all of these amazing things as a sign of God's love and compassion. Pause to say sorry for the times when you failed to trust in him.

May you feel the love which freely forgives those who deny him, who slip up in their following of him, who forget - at times - to love, welcome and build up others as he does. The power of the cross, the power of his love heals us and frees us.



Christ is the one who died forsaken and betrayed; who, mocked and crucified, the price of pardon paid. Our dying Lord, what grief and loss, what bitter cross, our souls restored!

Across our villages and the worldwide Church, this prayer is being said today. Add your voice to this earthly circle of prayer to our God whose love is unbreakable.


God of constant mercy,

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### LISTENING TO GOD'S WORD

### The cost of being a disciple

Large crowds were travelling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: 'If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters – yes, even their own life – such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

'Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish."

'Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to


oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples.

Luke 14:25-33

### **Price of the Prize**

Jesus is inviting his hearers to think about the challenge of following him, and why they would want to do this. Is the price that they are likely to pay in this life worth the prize of eternal life? He is saying, 'Do not set out on this path if you aren't able to commit yourself to the whole journey.' One of his examples invites us to think of Ukraine today. When the Russian forces amassed on Ukraine's borders invaded in February 2022, President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and the people had a choice - stand up to the Russian army and fight to retain their freedom or, recognising how massively outnumbered they are, give in and seek to negotiate a painful peace. As we know, as a nation, courageously they decided and continue to believe that the sovereign prize was worth the costly price.

How is this true for your journey of life and faith? When you chose to follow Jesus and apply his teaching to your daily life, you said 'Yes' to weaving a positive path through life. You rejected all that is selfish or hurtful to others. You rejected the force of public opinion and chose to see the world's problems through our Lord's eyes. You offer hope to those who feel hopeless. All because our Lord's promise of an even more glorious life beyond this life. Think about how the prize is worth the price.
